Candidates can only qualify through this route if they meet our <u>transitional requirements [https://contact.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/legal-practice-course-route/becoming-solicitor-legal-practice-course-transitional-requirements/]</u>.

If they do not meet these, they will need to qualify under the <u>SQE</u> [<u>https://contact.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/sqe/]</u>.

Trainees should ideally attend and successfully complete the <u>Professional</u> <u>Skills Course [https://contact.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/legal-practice-course-</u> <u>route/professional-skills-course/professional-skills-course-information-pack/]</u> (PSC) during the period of recognised training. However, trainees can still be admitted if they do the course after their training.

The course is offered by <u>authorised providers</u> [https://contact.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/legal-practice-course-route/professional-skillscourse/professional-skills-course-providers/], on an external or in-house basis. The PSC guidelines give full details of the course content and the authorisation requirements. You must pay for a trainee's first attempt

Your organisation is not required to allow time off for study of the PSC, but you may wish to consider whether to offer paid study leave.
